We are honored you are visiting today. * Liturgy **Books** may be found on the **Candle Table** at the back of the church. * We **invite you to fill out a Visitor's Card**, also on the Candle Table & place it in one of the Collection Baskets there. * We do not take up a **Collection** during our services but rather ask you to place donations in one of the baskets on the Candle Table or next to the **Book Store Table**. * While only Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves may receive **Holy Communion**, everyone is welcome to come forward at the end of Liturgy to receive a blessing from our priest and to take the blessed bread. * It is the **Orthodox practice** to stand during services as a sign of reverence for the Lord but if you need to sit, please do so. Use of chairs is shared. If you are able, we particularly try to stand during the processions with the Gospel and the Gifts, during the Readings, the Creed, during the preparation of the Holy Eucharist, the Lord's Prayer and reception of Communion. * We **invite you** to stay after the Thanksgiving Prayers **for fellowship** and coffee, so that we may greet you personally, and to answer any questions you may have about our faith, our parish or today's service. * Please help yourself to the brochures and information on the east side counter. * All children **ages three through twelve** are encouraged to attend our Sunday School after Holy Communion.

PALM SUNDAY FISH DINNER FUND RAISER TODAY: Baked Fish, Rice Pilaf, Green Beans, Salad, Rolls, Pie and Beverages. Suggested Donation: Adults \$8⁰⁰, Child's Plate: \$4⁰⁰, Extra piece of Fish: \$3⁰⁰. As always, this is a suggestion. Any amount is welcome or you are welcome to be a guest of the Sisterhood.

RED EGGS FOR PASCHA! There is a sign up sheet to donate red eggs which will be given out at the end of the Paschal Liturgy. Please purchase Greek Red Dye in the Bookstore or dye them with onion skins. Please sign up for each dozen you commit to bring. Bring eggs beginning Holy Thursday night and put them in the refrigerator next to the stove. They must be at church no later than 11:15pm, before the Paschal services begin.

SIGN UP TO READ THE PSALMS OR THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES AT THE TOMB: The sign up sheet is on the Literature Table. Reading of the Psalms on Holy Friday begins around 4:30pm until 6:00pm, then 8:00pm through the night, ending just before 9:30am on Holy Saturday. Reading of the Acts begins 10:30pm on Holy Saturday, ending just before 11:30pm. Reading is done in a plain non-dramatic way. If you have questions, please see Fr Nikolay.

SLEEP ROOM FOR CHILDREN ON PASCHA NIGHT: The Library will be available as a children's sleep room as in past years. Please bring pillows and blankets/sleeping bags. Parents are responsible for taking turns minding the children. There must be 2 parents on duty at all times. There will be 2 chairs next to the door reserved for the "on duty" parents. Please leave the door open at all times.

PASCHA FOOD BASKET BLESSING: Tables will be set up on the east patio for your baskets. Baskets will be blessed after Paschal Divine Liturgy & after the Paschal Vespers Sunday afternoon. There are flyers on the Literature Table that describe the tradition. There is also a sheet titled *Holy Week One Day at a Time* describing the services of Holy Week & some of the other traditions of Holy Week and Pascha.

DONATIONS NEEDED FOR PASCHA FLOWERS. A special basket has been put out on the bulletin table for donations to purchase Palms and Willows and flowers to decorate the tomb on Holy Friday and Pascha. Please mark checks "Flowers" on the memo line.

THE BOOKSTORE has copies of the new book for Book Study, *Precious Vessels of the Holy Spirit*, red egg dye, Pascha cards, prayer ropes, beaded prayer bracelets, finger beads, and service books for Holy Week. We also received a generous donation of used books and they are priced to sell. The used books have a USED sticker to identify them.

PASCHA NIGHT KITCHEN & POTLUCK: The kitchen volunteers will not be in the kitchen to handle any foods that are brought. The kitchen oven will be set at 200°. PLEASE, DO NOT CHANGE IT!!! We need ALL meats, cheeses, breads and desserts, etc. to be brought to church cut up and on a plate, ready to be served. Use disposable trays, bowls and pans where possible. Please bring meat that is being warmed, including spiral hams, roasts and whole chickens sliced and removed from the bone prior to coming to church. There will be a few outlets for crock pots. We need everyone to be responsible for helping clean up the tables, trays, and putting up the chairs & tables after the Pascha meal. PLEASE PUT YOUR CHAIRS AWAY WHEN YOU LEAVE. If the food that you bring will be safe to save and serve on Thomas Sunday, please package it and put it in the refrigerator. If this is not the case, please take home any of your leftover food. Thank you.
