St Innocent of Alaska

COMMEMORATED THIS THURSDAY, October 6th

St Innocent, Metropolitan of Moscow, Enlightener of the Aleuts and Apostle to America (in the world John Popov-Veniaminov), was born on August 26, 1797 in the village of Anginsk in the Irkutsk diocese, into the family of a sacristan. The boy mastered his studies at an early age and by age seven, he was reading the Epistle in church. In 1806 they sent him to the Irkutsk seminary. In 1814, the new rector thought it proper to change the surnames of some of the students. John Popov received the surname Veniaminov in honor of the deceased Archbishop Benjamin of Irkutsk. St Innocent fell asleep in the Lord on March 31, 1879, on Holy Saturday, and was buried at the Holy Spirit Church of the Trinity-St Sergius Lavra. On October 6, 1977, St Innocent was glorified by the Russian Orthodox Church.

Hieromartyr Cyprian & Justina the Virgin

COMMEMORATED THIS DAY

Justina lived with her parents, Edesius and Cleodonia in Antioch. Edesius was a pagan priest, and his entire household was pagan. Justina visited a Christian church, learned the true Faith & converted both her father and mother. All three received baptism. A certain dissolute pagan youth was willing to pay any price to charm Justina, for she was beautiful and he sought help from Cyprian, a magician, who consorted with impure spirits and practiced sorcery.. Cyprian invoked one evil spirit after another, to inflame Justina with impure passion, but did not succeed. By the sign of the Cross and prayer to God, she drove the evil spirits away. After this futile effort, Cyprian recognized the power of the Cross and was baptized. Eventually, he was made a presbyter, then a bishop. Embittered pagans denounced him and Justina; both were tried in Damascus, tortured, and then beheaded in Nicomedia. They entered into rest at the end of the third century.
