If you are able, we particularly try to stand during the processions with the Gospel and the Gifts, during the Readings, the Creed, during the preparation of the Holy Eucharist, the Lord's Prayer and reception of Communion. * We **invite you** to stay after the Thanksgiving Prayers **for fellowship** and the meal so that we may greet you personally, and to answer any questions you may have about our faith, our parish or today's service. * Please help yourself to the brochures and information on the east side counter. * All children **ages three through twelve** are encouraged to attend our Sunday School after Holy Communion.

IT HAS BEEN AROUND 10 YEARS SINCE WE'VE HAD AN OFFICIAL ARCHPASTORAL VISIT TO OUR PARISH. We are all filled with joy and excitement about Bishop Alexander being in our midst on the last weekend of this month. Please allow me to share with you some points of Orthodox etiquette pertinent to His Grace being with us. When the Bishop is present please do not ask the priest for a blessing, but make a small reverence before His Grace (without crossing yourself), and then place your right hand over your left (palms up) and say "Master Bless", then kiss his right hand. Please do your best to arrive at Church and finish with venerating icons and lighting candles before the Bishop's arrival at 9:00 a.m. If you arrive late, it is best that

you simply go to your place and venerate icons and light candles after the conclusion of the service. During the Archpastoral Liturgy there are times when the Bishop blesses with special long candles called "Dikiri & Trikirii". Please bow towards His Grace as he makes this blessing in your direction. After the small entrance there are several times when only the clergy are supposed to sing. Your cue for those hymns would be that the choir will not be singing, only the clergy. Thank you for your help in giving our Bishop a proper welcome to our wonderful Parish!

ACQUIRING THE MIND OF CHRIST: *Embracing the Vision of the Orthodox Church:* On October 18th we'll begin a new book study on this work of Archimandrite Sergius. "St Paul clearly states: 'Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus...' (Phil 2:5.) How do we acquire this Mind of Christ and where is it to be found? For the Orthodox Christian, salvation is the acquisition of this Mind of Christ which is to be found in the Church. This acquisition moves us from the image of God to the likeness of God; through our obedience to this call we begin to know God and this knowledge is eternal life (John 17:3). This small book hopes to begin to answer how acquiring the Mind of Christ is possible and why it is necessary in our lives today. Fr Archimandrite Sergius serves as the 16th Abbot of St Tikhon's Monastery." The book is available in our parish bookstore for \$15.
