Use of chairs is shared. If you are able, we particularly try to stand during the processions with the Gospel and the Gifts, during the Readings, the Creed, during the preparation of the Holy Eucharist, the Lord's Prayer and reception of Communion. \* **We invite you** to stay after the Thanksgiving Prayers **for fellowship** and coffee, so that we may greet you personally, and to answer any questions you may have about our faith, our parish or today's service. \* Please help yourself to the brochures and information on the Literature Table. \* **We hope you will visit us again.***

## ANNOUNCEMENTS & NOTICES

- **THERE WILL BE A SPECIAL COLLECTION TODAY** to defray the cost of **Fr Nikolay** & his family's visit to us from March 31<sup>st</sup> to April 7<sup>th</sup>. Fr Nikolay will be assisting Father George with the Holy Week and Pascha services.
- **PASCHA FLOWER DONATIONS ARE WELCOMED.** There is a basket on the Candle Table for donations for Palm Sunday and Pascha flowers.
- **HOLY FRIDAY DECORATING OF THE TOMB:** We need the women and girls of the parish to come at **11:00am** on Holy Friday to decorate the tomb.
- **WON'T YOU WATCH FOR ONE HOUR?** Please sign up to keep vigil at the tomb beginning after the Vespers of Holy Friday. While keeping watch, we quietly read aloud the Psalms. Hopefully, we will also have people keeping watch throughout Friday night. If you have any questions, please see choir director, **Diane Prokipchak**. A sign up sheet is on the Literature Table.
- **LUMINARIAS FOR PASCHA NIGHT:** If you can help assemble these and then put them out and light them Pascha night, please let **Diane Prokipchak** know. We have sand that can be used.
- **RED EGGS FOR PASCHA:** There is a sign up sheet on the Literature Table for anyone who is willing to make red-dyed hard boiled eggs for Pascha. They need to be brought to church by **11:30pm**, Holy Saturday evening before we begin Nocturnes. You can bring them Holy Friday or Holy Saturday morning. We use Greek red dye (for sale in the bookstore) or onion skins to get them the deep shade of red we need.
- **SLEEP ROOM FOR CHILDREN ON PASCHA NIGHT.** The Library will be available for children to sleep during the Pascha night services. Parents will need to take turns minding the door to make sure the children are safe. We will have a chair outside the door reserved for you. Children need to bring their own pillow and sleeping bag or blanket.
- **PASCHA FOOD BASKET BLESSINGS.** Pascha night, we will have the tables set out on the east patio for your Paschal baskets. Please remember that at the time of the blessing food items need to be unwrapped at least a little to receive the sprinkling with holy water. For those unable to attend the Paschal night service, Father George will bless also baskets at the end of the **3:00pm** Paschal Vespers on Sunday. **"How To Put Together A Traditional Pascha Basket"** & **"The Services Of Holy Week"** flyers are on the literature table.
- **FROM THE MONEY COUNTERS:** Please include on your checks on the "For: \_\_\_\_" line your donation, i.e. Tithe, Candles, Bldg Fund, etc. About 50% of the checks are undesignated, so we have to guess and it takes time to write this in. Our prime responsibility is to see that the money goes where the donor wants it to go.
