We are honored you are visiting today. \* Liturgy **Books** may be found next to the **Candle Table** at the back of the church. \* We **invite you to fill out a Visitor's Card** on the Candle Table & place it in one of the Collection Baskets there. \* We do not take up a **Collection** during our services but rather ask you to place donations in one of the baskets on the Candle Table or next to the **Book Store Table**. \* While only Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves may receive **Holy Communion**, everyone is welcome to come forward at the end of Liturgy to receive a blessing from our priest and to take the blessed bread. \* It is the **Orthodox practice** to stand during services as a sign of reverence for the Lord but if you need to sit, please do so. Use of chairs is shared. If you are able, we particularly try to stand during the processions with the Gospel and the Gifts, during the Readings, the Creed, during the preparation of the Holy Eucharist, the Lord's Prayer and reception of Communion. \* We **invite you** to stay after the Thanksgiving Prayers **for fellowship** and the meal so that we may greet you personally, and to answer any questions you may have about our faith, our parish or today's service. \* Please help yourself to the brochures and information on the east side counter. \* All children **ages three through twelve** are encouraged to attend our Sunday School after Holy Communion.

## ANNOUNCEMENTS

**THE CHILDREN FROM OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL ARE HAVING A LENTEN COLLECTION OF MEN'S SHOES FOR S' MARTIN'S HOSPITALITY CENTER.** There is a box in the library where you can put either new or gently worn shoes. If you have any questions please contact our Sunday School Coordinator, Subdeacon Silouan Parchert at 505-440-1604.

**DONATIONS TO PURCHASE FLOWERS:** We appreciate your Special Donations to purchase the Palm Sunday palms and willows and flowers to decorate the tomb on Holy Friday & Pascha. Please mark your check "flowers" on the memo line and place in the Tithes & Contributions box.

**RED EGGS FOR PASCHA!** There is a sign up sheet to donate the red eggs which are traditionally given out at the end of the Paschal Liturgy. Please use brown eggs, which give a better color, and purchase Greek Red Dye in the Bookstore or dye them with onion skins. Commercial PAAS type dye does not give the blood red color needed. Please sign up for each dozen you commit to bring. Bring eggs beginning Holy Thursday night and put them in the refrigerator next to the stove. They must be at church no later than 11:15pm before Paschal services begin but we prefer to have them at church by Holy Saturday morning.

**SIGN UP TO BRING ITEMS FOR THE HOLY SATURDAY AGAPE MEAL.** We break our fast after the Holy Saturday Vesperal Divine Liturgy with a small, traditional agape meal. We need grapes, figs, dates, bread and wine. The table is set up with all the food ready to be served before the service starts at 9:30am, so please slice/plate/portion your food at home or come early enough to do it before the service begins. Please cut grapes into small bunches.

**SISTERHOOD ANNUAL PALM SUNDAY FISH DINNER FUNDRAISER:** We will have baked fish, rice pilaf, green beans, salad, rolls, dessert and beverages. Gluten free dessert will be available. Suggested donation is \$10<sup>.00</sup> adult plate, \$5<sup>.00</sup> for child plate. Extra pieces of Fish \$3<sup>.00</sup>. Everyone is encouraged to stay regardless of ability donate for the meal as we would be honored to have you as a guest of St. Anna.

**SIGN UP TO READ THE PSALMS OR THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES AT THE TOMB:** The sign up sheet is on the Literature Table. Reading of the Psalms on Holy Friday begins around 4:30pm until 6:00pm, then 8:00pm through the night, ending just before 9:30am on Holy Saturday. Reading of the Acts begins 10:30pm on Holy Saturday, ending just before 11:30pm. Reading is done in a plain non-dramatic way. If you have questions, please see Fr Nikolay.

**SLEEP ROOM FOR CHILDREN PASCHA NIGHT:** The Library will be available as a children's sleep room as in past years. Please bring pillows and blankets/sleeping bags. Parents are responsible for taking turns minding the children. There must be 2 unrelated parents on duty at all times. There will be 2 chairs next to the door reserved for the "on duty" parents. Please leave the door open at all times.

**PASCHA NIGHT KITCHEN & POTLUCK** The kitchen volunteers will not be in the kitchen to handle any foods that are brought. The kitchen oven will be set at 200°. DO NOT CHANGE IT PLEASE!! We need ALL meats, cheeses, breads and desserts, etc. to be brought to church cut up and on a plate, ready to be served. Use disposable trays, bowls and pans where possible. Please bring meat that is being warmed, including spiral hams, roasts and whole chickens sliced and removed from the bone prior to coming to church. There will be a few outlets for crock pots. We need everyone to be responsible for helping clean up the tables, trays, and putting up the chairs & tables after the Pascha meal. PLEASE PUT YOUR CHAIRS AWAY WHEN YOU LEAVE. If the food that you bring will be safe to save & serve on St. Thomas Sunday, please package it and put it in the refrigerator. If this is not the case, take home any of your leftover food.

**PLEASE BRING OLD PALM SUNDAY BRANCHES TO THE CHURCH.** As many of you know we shouldn't discard old Palm Sunday branches, paper icons, old calendars with icons on them, greeting cards with icons, and basically anything that has been blessed, in the trash. Rather, please bring such unwanted holy items to the Church, and we'll take them to the Monastery of the Archangel Michael, where the monks will burn them and bury the ash in a place where no one walks. Such is the Orthodox way of appropriately dealing with holy waste. Thank you!
