FUNDRAISING BREAKFAST BY THE ST ANNA'S SISTERHOOD

HIEROMARTYR DIONYSIUS THE AREOPAGITE THE BISHOP OF ATHENS COMMEMORATED THIS DAY

Dionysius is numbered among the Seventy Lesser Apostles. Having completed the school of philosophy in Athens, he went to Egypt to study further. While he was there the Lord Christ died on the Cross, the sun was darkened, and there was darkness in Egypt for three hours. Then Dionysius cried out: Either God the Creator of the world is suffering, or this world is coming to an end. He became a member of the highest court among the Greeks, the Areopagus, and thereafter he was known as the "Areopagite." When the Apostle Paul preached the Gospel in Athens, Dionysius was baptized with his entire household. Paul consecrated him Bishop of Athens. He traveled with Paul for a long time and met all the other apostles of Christ. He traveled to Jerusalem especially to see the Most-holy Theotokos, and described his encounter with her in one of his written works. He was present at the burial of the Holy and Most-pure One. Dionysius suffered during the reign of Dometian in the year 96. He wrote several famous works: The Divine Names of God, The Celestial and Ecclesiastical Hierarchies, Mystical Theology, and The Most-holy Theotokos.
